RECOGNIZE.


CTF honors excellence in transportation at the annual CTF Transportation Awards ceremony, where top honors in 18 different categories are awarded each year. CTF provides service pins and funding for recognition ceremonies for Caltrans workers.





REMEMBER.

CTF provides grants + matching funds for injured + fallen workers. We administer memorial scholarships, collect funds for memorial signs + support annual **Workers Memorial ceremonies** in-district and at the Capitol.





EDUCATE.

CTF offers 45 scholarships to support high school, undergraduate and graduate students studying transportation-related fields. Many for children of Caltrans workers or Caltrans student assistants and employees.






Who can apply?

- Students must be U.S. citizens,
 permanent residents or
 documented international students
 and living in California at the time of
 their application





How to Apply?

- Scholarship opportunities are organized by Graduate and Undergraduate education level
- Each scholarship has its' own application
- Open scholarships show a "apply now" with a deadline
- Closed scholarships have the date you can expect for the application to be available

- Each application will require you to create a log-in with Kaleidoscope
- Best part is you'll have access to all of our CTF Scholarship applications with a few exceptions
- You can view scholarship opportunities, start your application and save to return and finish later



Best Practices

- Essay response should reflect what you know and your perspective. Be creative and confident sharing your view.
 You want to give the selection committee a better idea of who you are.
- Personal Statement is your opportunity to share your story and provide context with your personal experiences that got you to where you are now
- Give detail but be concise in your response
- Highlight your awards, activities and work experience however big or small you think it may be

WTS Scholarships: Overview

What

- Scholarships for women studying transportation and related fields
- All Education Levels
 - University Graduate & Undergraduate
 - Trade School/Community College
 - High School Seniors
- All applications submitted through local WTS Chapter
- All Chapters have some variation in requirements and scholarships available

When & Where

- Applications generally available in October
- Applications generally due November/December
- Search for your local chapter at: https://www.wtsinternational.org/chapters



WTS Scholarships: Useful Tips

- Read through the requirements completely
- Request transcripts early
- Request recommendation letters early
- Call or email with questions
- Write letters, essays and personal statements to the areas highlighted by the application
- Get the application in on time!

Example Selection Criteria

Career Goals	10%	
Curriculum & Grades Commitment to Transport	15%	20%
Writing Skills	25%	20 /0
Recommendation	10%	



WTS Scholarships: Reviewer Comments

YES!

- "Notes college-level leadership in extracurricular programs."
- "Is pursuing transportation degree and is already working at R.E.Y."
- "Several leadership experiences described in statement."
- "Notes college-level leadership in extracurricular programs"
- "Also shows interest in encouraging more girls in STEM at her high school."

NO!

- "Applicant is not considering a major in a transportation-related field."
- "Missing response to Part II and Part III. Missing transcript."
- "Personal statement is over the word count."
- "Recycled content was not addressed to WTS."



WTS Scholarships: FAQ's & Useful Tips

- Yes, apply for more than one scholarship*
- Yes, fill out a separate application for each scholarship
- You can use the same recommendation letters.
- Submit one complete package, including transcripts and letters
- *Some chapters do not allow this

COMTO Scholarships

- In 2023, COMTO NorCal awarded \$30,000 in scholarships.

Eligibility Criteria

- Undergrad or Grad minority who is a Northern California resident or actively enrolled in an accredited university or community college in NorCal
- Demonstrated intent to pursue career in transportation
- Demonstrated financial need
- Minimum GPA of 2.5 or above
- Must be at least entering into sophomore year
- Demonstrated commitment to advancing disadvantaged communities of color



Application Elements

- Student Application Form
- Letter of Motivation Essay (250-500 words)
 - Describe your life goals
 - Describe your transportation-related career aspirations
- Statement of Financial Need (250-500 words)
 - Explain how you are paying for college now.
 - Explain difficulties you are having in meeting your needs.
 - Talk about how you would benefit from the scholarship.



Application Elements


- College Transcripts
 - Include your <u>entire college history</u> with all grades
 - Does not have to be an official transcript
- Resume (up to 2 pages)
- References One Mandatory, Two Suggested
 - One must be academic from a college instructor, counselor, or advisor
 - One can be professional, academic, or personal
 - Letters ideally prepared on official letterhead

Letter of Recommendation from a Professor

Preparing to Make the Request

- 1. Carefully read the application
 - What questions will the professor have to answer?
 - What details does the letter have to contain?
- 2. Consider which professors actually know you well enough to answer the questions and provide the details
 - What have you done in that person's class that relates to the required information?



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Making the Request

- 3. Remember that the professor is doing you a favor
 - Most MTI professors have fulltime jobs, as well as teaching at MTI
- 4. Make your request in writing, preferably in an email with appropriate attachments, that have been CARFFULLY PROOFRFAD
 - Use the professor's title and name in the request
 - Make the time commitment clear
 - How long is the letter supposed to be?
 - When is the letter due to the organization? Allow at least 2 weeks.
 - How is the letter to be sent? an emailed .pdf? Does it require a wet signature that is scanned or is DocuSign acceptable?
 - Make sure that the professor has agreed through a written commitment to write the letter within the timeframe; if you are unsure, send a follow-up email asking, "Does your schedule permit you to create and send the letter by [date]?"



Making the Request

- 5. Attach everything that the professor will need to provide the letter of recommendation
 - URL for the organization's website with the details about the letter of recommendation
 - Name and address (USPS, email or website) where the letter will be sent
 - Clearly state whether the letter is sent as an original .pdf or whether there is a form that the professor must complete at the organization's website, or are there both a form and a personal letter required?
- 6. Attach everything that the professor will need to create content for the letter
 - The semester and course that you had with the professor
 - Your resume professional history relevant to the letter, current job, list of courses completed in the MSTM program, GPA
 - Anything that would make you memorable, e.g., topic of your final paper, leadership role in class

Following Up Your Request: Closing the Loop

- 7. Two or three days before the letter was due, follow up with the receiving organization to ensure that all of your documents have been received, including your letters of recommendation.
 - If any letters are missing try to find out which ones have been received and follow up with the sender of the missing letter. If unsure which letter is missing, send a POLITE email to all the requested letter writers.
 - Write a POLITE email saying, "Thank you for agreeing to send a letter of recommendation to XXX for me. Please let me know if I can provide any additional information. The letter is due [date]."
- 8. When the letter has been received, send a thank you email to the professor, stating your appreciation for the professor's time and support.
- 9. When you get a final response from the organization, send an email to the professor with the outcome (e.g., got or did not get the scholarship) and restate your appreciation for the professor's time and support.
- Remember that you may need another letter from the professor in the future, so be sure you are remembered positively.


Application Tips:

Do:

- Follow application directions
- Start with your school/program
- Be specific in essays and statements
- Save content for other applications
- Keep track of deadlines
- Request letters of recommendation early
- Use Templates
- Look for national scholarships

Don't:

- Go off topic
- Go over word counts
- Forget to spell check proofread
